- Health and Wellness Promotion
 - o For members who need reminders, follow-up assistance and health coaching

- Disease Management
 - For members needing support to manage a health condition, such as diabetes and hypertension
- Transitional Care Management
 - This program begins after going home from a hospital or Skilled Nursing Facility. Our nurse reaches out to ensure:
 - Understanding of the care plan
 - Connection back to their primary care provider in a timely manner
 - All needed services and resources are in place to transition home
- Complex Care Management
 - o For members who need additional nursing support due to complex medical and/or social conditions
- In collaboration with our partners at First Carolina Care, additional care management supports are provided:
 - Specialty care management for unique situations, such as transplants
 - o Very high risk program for members requiring an interdisciplinary care coordination approach
